The Directors met on August 26th in preparation for Gloria Loughman's visit and to set the agenda for the MC meeting.


Please check out the website for updates, meeting minutes and calendar additions. The MC was held on September 9, and 16 people were present.

Stupendous Stitching

Get to know your machine's stitches like never before with this stupendous stitching class.

Bring your machine that has lots of stitches and your creative imagination for an enjoyable day creating wall art from fabric and threads and specialty stitching.

In the workshop, you will learn to embellish fabric using decorative stitches, various threads, cord, yarn, beads, and angel hair.

Instructor: Gwynn LePoidevin

Some of you know me from the Christmas Fair and some of you know me from the October Homewood Retreat. My name is Gwynn LePoidevin and I have been quilting for 30 years. I was born and raised in Victoria and when the last of my children finished school, we went to the Interior for 16 years. Before we left, I bought a small sewing machine and took 1 quilting class.

I still have the first piece I ever made. That piece was an arched wall hanging with some appliqué on it. The teacher had a sample that had stippling with leaves on it. When I was finished the piece, I did the same stippling and leaves as she had done and took it in to show her not realizing that this was not something a beginner would do.

From then on, I was hooked. Everything I learned increased my love of quilting and teaching this art. Classes I have taught include appliqué, paper piecing, wallet making, stippling, hand quilting and freehand quilting and the art of thread work quilting.

I look forward to seeing you at the Stupendous Stitching Class in October 2024.

Deb Morrissey Bio

It's been 20 years since I started my totally unplanned quilting journey! In the spring of 2004 I pieced my first quilt (a queen size Yellow Brick Road) in 5 days and was hooked. I started working at Huckleberry's in July of that year and I remember being so fearful of anyone asking me any questions on my first day. I quickly learned the many aspects of quilting and was teaching within 5 months of starting my job. My background was a primary teacher so I suppose the organization skills transferred well to quilting classes.

I've taught many different classes over the past 19 years and always like to challenge myself. Hence, I also learned to ruler quilt - I remember not having resources when I started so it was a challenge for me to figure out the ins and outs of how to use rulers but I found the biggest learning curve was how to move a ruler with the fabric and not veer off the ruler foot. Once I mastered the movement I learned how to use the angles on the straight line ruler and the various markings to create lines that were equal distances apart (in 1/4" intervals) as well as using those same markings to create angular shapes within a space.

The best thing about straight line ruler work is that it fits all shapes - this isn't true with circles/curves/etc as you have to audition curved rulers to see how or if they will fit the space your are quilting. This basic ruler quilting class delves into straight line ruler work (it is challenging enough to guide the presser foot along a straight edge so that is why we will only be using a straight line ruler).

You will be amazed at how versatile a straight line can be. If you want to expand into circles and curvy rulers you can take the information from this class and much can be applied to those rulers. The key to any quilting - free motion or ruler work - is to make sure you take the time to practise. I know this class will give you the start you need to embark on your ruler work journey and the detailed handout will make it easy to reference ideas for your projects (or to refresh your memory of what we did in class!).






QUADRA HOMEWOOD RETREAT OCTOBER 21 - 25, 2024

COMFORT QUILTS




